




2018 Value of Water Survey


In 2018, Wareham Water performed a project funded by a Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection grant. One task of the project was to assess on a local basis, how customers value water and what the customers of the District are willing to pay for this resource versus better water quality. The survey was mailed to approximately 8,200 customers in the District and about 1,450 responses were returned. The majority of received responses were from retired or fixed income residents and generally represent the view of customers older than 60 years old. Here we share abbreviated results for your reference and consideration.












Of interest in the survey was how residents prioritized their water expenditures, estimated at \$520 annually at time of report, compared to other household bills. Generally about 70% or greater of the respondents indicated they find water as or more valuable than other categories. The typical amount spent in other categories from the 2016 Bureau of Labor Statistics is provided for reference.
